Seeds of A Sower

I've taken several trips to Stockton recently. My favorite route is through the Delta. I enjoy the natural scenery, especially the birds. I've seen several flocks flying in V formation. I'm amazed by the beauty of the long-legged egrets, whose wingspan is nearly as long as I am tall! They look so majestic in flight.

Scripture offers some images of God as a bird. In worship we recently heard Jesus' desire to gather the people of Jerusalem as a mother hen gathers her brood. In the nest they find comfort and safety and need not fear, for the mother hen provides for their needs. Taking refuge under the shelter of God's wings is a common image in the Psalms (57:1; 61:4; 91:4). When the storms of life batter and bruise us, God welcomes us into the nest to be nurtured in the safety of God's love.

Another image of God in the scriptures is that of a mother eagle (Deut. 32:11-12; Exodus 19:4). This is the origin of the song, "And God will raise you up on eagle's wings, bear you on the breath of dawn, make you to shine like the sun, and hold you in the palm of God's hands." When the mother eagle teaches her eaglets to fly and to hunt their own food, she will suddenly swoop downward to force them into solo flight. She stays close to swoop them up again when they grow too weary to continue on their own. This is a beautiful picture of our loving God, caring for us when we are weak, yet always aiming toward the goal of our maturity and inner strength.
