Our music ministry has taken on some new dimensions under Ronald Sutherland's leadership this year. Ronald has offered special music and song leadership at our 8:30 service, enhancing that worship experience. Joyful Beginnings Preschool is a daily outreach to the community. Vacation Bible School is a significant ministry for our congregation and community. There are always areas for growth, among them intentional systems for following up with newcomers, adult education, and small groups.

Most significantly, behind the numbers above are people, hopefully people whose lives are being changed in positive ways as they experience Christ's love through our ministry together. In the end, spiritual growth, not numerical growth, is our mission and purpose. Through a culture of hospitality, the valuing of relationships, a vision of mission, and the love of God, we trust that we will grow in quality and depth.

#### CHURCH BUILDING USE

Our congregation is very generous in sharing our building with our church family and the community. With all the groups using our facility, we have hundreds of people on campus every week. The heavy building use requires detailed coordination on the part of the office and custodial staff.

If you are planning to use the church building, we ask your assistance in the following ways:

- Schedule all events with Lorri Sullivan, the Office Administrator, through the master church calendar in the office. Events are generally scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis. Office hours are Monday-Thursday, 8:00-12 noon and 1:00-4:30 p.m.
- Donations for building use are requested of several groups. This should be discussed with the Office Administrator.
- As a non-profit organization, church rooms cannot be rented to profit-making ventures on an ongoing basis.
- Plan ahead to make arrangements to borrow necessary keys during office hours and return them promptly after the event.
- Set-ups for events should be submitted to the church office a week prior to the event.
- The custodian does regular cleaning chores, but non-church groups should generally return rooms to the condition in which they were found (or better!), unless they are paying a clean-up fee. Kitchen clean-up is the responsibility of the groups using it.
- When you are finished, please turn off lights and thermostats, close all windows, and lock the building. All doors should be carefully checked to make sure they are closed tightly and locked. The Fellowship Hall doors often do not latch properly.
- Chairs and tables may only be borrowed by request through the Church Administrator. Events on campus have first-priority; if they are needed at church, we can't have them off-site! When equipment is returned, please place it inside the building where it belongs.

Thank you for helping keep our church campus safe, clean, and accessible.
