
#### Welcome LUMC's Summer Organist







**Book Review - "The Confident Woman", Joyce Meyer** 








The following note was received from Stanley Moms in Touch who pray Thursday mornings in Maggie Mae:

# Looking for a Good Summer Read? The Heart of Christianity is highly recommended!

During the Lent and Easter season, the Monday morning P.R.A.Y. the Bible group read and studied the book, *The Heart of Christianity*, by Marcus Borg. Group members found it a helpful framing of Christian faith and beliefs for our time. Following are some of the group member's

reflections.

I have been looking for a spiritual path for a few years, after leaving church during my youth. I have believed in Jesus and tried to live by His teachings all my life. I wanted to combine my everyday life with the traditions and community a church can offer. I wasn't sure I was pursuing the right path until I read The Heart of Christianity by Marcus Borg. This theologian has investigated his faith and spoke to me as an interpreter of the words of Jesus and the path to God. Building the Kingdom of God on earth is the purpose of all human existence. Reading this book and discussing it with Pastor Lori and the others in our group gave me a lot of insight into what it means to be a Christian. It is our duty to worship God, take care of each other and seek Justice for all of God's creations. I highly recommend this book and the P.R.A.Y. meetings each Monday morning.
