




JUST AROUND THE CORNER! LUMC'S SILENT AUCTION – SUNDAY, OCTOBER 7

NO LOCKS!!!!!

Last Sunday Ginny Leavitt was talking to our "Young Disciples" about "No Locks" regarding the game <u>Four Square</u> played at the school where Ginny used to teach. The "No Locks" term means that no one could be locked out or denied the opportunity to play the game.

Well, it is just like that with the LUMC Pooled Income Fund. There are NO LOCKS on our Pooled Income Fund which means that EVERYONE can become a part of the Fund.

With the game Four Square there are always some winners and some losers. That is the way it is with competitive games. HOWEVER, with our Pooled Income Fund there are ONLY WINNERS. There are NO LOSERS. The Pooled Income Fund is a WIN – WIN situation. Donors win because they get a handsome income for the rest of their lives, they get a very generous charitable contribution deduction that reduces their income taxes AND LUMC wins because a gift has been made to the church to ensure our programs will be able to continue into the future. So, actually you could say it is a WIN –WIN – WIN situation.

The only one you could argue is a loser is the Internal Revenue Service because our Pooled Income Fund donors SAVE substantial <u>income taxes</u>. But, are we not all trying to win that game!!!



Church Council Meeting Minutes - July 17, 2007

Attendees: Pastor Lori Sawdon, Pat Hershey, Ginny Leavitt, David White, Jack Cotteral, Tom Henderson, Carol Slatten, Ginny Cowden, Doug Cowden, Dean Coons and Robyn Roberts **Meeting Called to Order -** Council Chairperson Pat Hershey called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Joys and concerns were shared and the meeting was opened with prayer.

Approval of the May Minutes - Ginny Leavitt moved to approve the May 15, 2007 Church Council Meeting Minutes. Carol Slatten seconded the motion. Robyn Roberts abstained from the vote as she was not present at the May meeting. The motion passed unanimously by the voting members of the Council.

Devotional - Pastor Lori shared from the book *Christianity for the Rest of Us* by Diana Butler Bass regarding the ministry of justice. The Council discussed this topic in light of the summer sermon series on leadership.

REPORTS

<u>Staff Parish -</u> Staff Parish Chairperson Ginny Cowden reported that the search for a new organist and a youth director were under way. Ginny also noted that the Staff Parish Relations Committee is in the process of creating a written personnel policies and procedures manual.

<u>Lay Leadership</u> - Pastor Lori reported that the Lay Leadership team is scheduled to hold its first meeting on July 19, 2007 to discern leaders for church teams and committees in the coming year.

<u>Finance</u> - Finance Committee Chairperson, Ginny Leavitt reported that LUMC received an unexpectedly large workers' compensation bill and a team was in place to address this issue with LUMC's insurance broker.

- •David White presented the June Treasurer's Report to the Church Council. (See attached). The year to date income is greater than expected but pledged income is less than expected. A reminder regarding pledges has been placed in the Tower Notes and some pledgers have communicated with the church regarding the status of their pledges. Non-pledged income is greater than expected.
- •David White also reported that he is continuing his work on revisions to the balance sheet.
- •David also announced that his three year term as treasurer is coming to a close this December and he would like the Lay Leadership Committee to provide a new treasurer to fill the post. The entire Church Council thanked David for the work he has done as treasurer.

Program Council - No Report was presented for the Program Council.

<u>Trustees</u> - Trustees Chairperson, Joe Darrell, is out of town. Pat Hershey reported at his request that Trustees are operating within the budget.

OLD BUSINESS - The LUMC task force selected to interface with the City of Lafayette regarding the city's Senior Housing project met with Eden Housing, the developer selected by the City for the project. Pursuant to this meeting, it was determined that the City is no longer considering any of LUMC's property as a potential site for the Senior Housing project. Eden Housing will be pursuing other options.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>Joyful Beginnings Licensing Resolution</u> - The attached Resolution was presented to the Church Council by Ginny Leavitt. The Resolution is needed for Joyful Beginnings attendance purposes. The Council engaged in discussion about the Resolution. Ginny Leavitt moved that the Council approve the Resolution. Tom Henderson seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

COMMUNICATIONS

<u>Annual Conference</u> - Pastor Lori presented the DVD provided to churches at Annual Conference. The DVD reflected the diversity of the Church in our conference and emphasized our unity in Christ. <u>Girl Scouts</u> - The Girl Scouts have presented LUMC with an award for supporting the activities of the Girl Scouts.

<u>Chamber of Commerce</u> - The Lafayette Chamber of Commerce presented LUMC with a commemorative award for fifty years of membership.

•The Council discussed locations for displaying these awards.

ADJOURN - Church Council Chairperson, Pat Hershey adjourned the meeting at approximately 8:50 p.m.

NEXT MEETING - Church Council meets next at 7:30 on Tuesday, September 18, 2007.
