LUMC CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES October 16, 2007

Attendees: Pat Hershey, Joe Darrell, David White, Tom Henderson, Carol Slatten, Robyn Roberts, Ginny Cowden, Pastor Lori Sawdon, and Mary Hobson

Council Chairperson Pat Hershey called the meeting to order at 7:35. Joys and concerns were shared and Pat led us in prayer.

Approval of September minutes

REPORTS

Staff Parish - Chairperson Ginny Cowden handed out the 2008 Pastor's Compensation Benefits and Reimbursements Report. Included in the Compensation Report are figures for health insurance. Because Pastor Lori continues to utilize private insurance, Staff Parish expects a saving of over \$1,000 compared to the insurance offered by the Conference. Pat Hershey brought up an adjustment to the Pastor's compensation pension which the Council was planning to make in 2008 due to a change in calculating

pastoral benefits by the Conference. Tom Henderson moved that we make this adjustment by adding \$365 to the Pastor's compensation as a merit increase. David White seconded. All approved. The new total would be \$52,890. Joe Darrell moved that we accept the Staff Parish report with the added amount. Robyn Roberts seconded. All approved.

Lay Leadership - Pastor Lori reported that the Lay Leadership committee is continuing to work on addressing challenges posed by transitions in various leadership positions. Finance - David passed out the Treasurer's Report. He reported that a Stewardship Campaign is being planned for October 21-November 18. He reported that the Finance Committee authorized him to apply earnings from investment accounts to offset some minor negative numbers in the 900 accounts. He also said that September was a good month and we will likely meet 2007 financial goals. Non-pledged giving has been high and we are in good shape in operating cash.

Program Council - Robyn Roberts reported that Winter Nights will be hosted by our Church November 5-12. She said that volunteers are needed. Robyn explained Winter Nights as a rotating shelter for homeless families. Families arrive at 5:30pm. each weeknight. Dinner is served at 6:30. Bedtime is at 9:30. All participants leave at approximately 6:30 am after having breakfast. The host church offers food, shelter, and activities. The maximum number of participants is about 30 people. The families stay through Monday morning and leave after breakfast. The families will be here for one week and they will be housed in the Fellowship Hall. Robyn asked for prayers for the participants and volunteers. People are needed to help with dinner, to run activities for children of different ages, and to stay overnight.

Pastor Lori reported that our church will be hosting the traditional Lafayette Chamber of Commerce breakfast before Thanksgiving on November 16. It will be catered by Dave's Cuisine and be held from 7:30 to 9 am.

Carol Slatten reported that the Crèche Display will be held on Saturday, December 8 from 1-3:00 and Sunday, December 9 from 12-2:00. Cookies and hot cider will be available in the Fireside Room. Help will be needed setting up and making and serving refreshments. The displays will be held in Fellowship Hall. Robyn volunteered to help. **Trustees -** Chairman Joe Darrell reported that the Trustees met on October 8. He said that they are within budget. A new refrigerator was purchased for the kitchen, thanks to a generous donor. A clean up crew of 10 people met on Sat., Oct. 13 and replaced plants outside, cleaned and replaced cabinet doors in the kitchen, cleaned the pews and polished the wood, repaired drywall, blew debris from the parking lot and washed windows.

OLD BUSINESS - None

NEW BUSINESS

David White brought up a request for keyboard use at worship. Pastor Lori will attend to this.

COMMUNICATIONS

Community workshops are being held regarding future development of Downtown Lafayette. Pastor Lori will try to make sure that we have a LUMC presence at the meetings to monitor developments and help people become aware that our church is helping the city in many ways.

Robyn said that there will be a Stewardship letter in the mail in which the theme will be announced, and there will be speakers during the services. Tom Henderson suggested we have an article in Tower Notes also.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50pm. The next meeting will be held on November 20.
