SEEDS OF A SOWER

I'm aware that this fall many folks have significant personal or professional issues to face which have created stress in their lives. In recent conversation with one member, we spoke of simplification as a helpful response to stress. Sometimes we need to lower our expectations in order to reduce the pressure in our lives. More people are getting better at saying, "No, not at this time." One of the consequences for a volunteer organization such as the church is that there will be fewer activities. That may not be all bad. We will want to focus our energies wisely in the most strategic events that help us fulfill our mission of EXPERIENCING AND EXPRESSING CHRIST'S LOVE. Asking how an event fulfills that purpose can assist us in determining what should take priority in our ministry.

It is unfortunate that we generally expect the holiday season we are embarking upon to be a stressful time. There will be extra events to attend, special meals to prepare, cards to send, gifts to purchase, and more. Perhaps the antidote to holiday stress is simplification. Is it necessary to fix that traditional side dish that Grandma always used to make, but which nobody really enjoys now? Would a personal handwritten note be as meaningful to a neighbor as a plate of homemade cookies?

A memorable experience of simplification was the two months our family lived in an apartment while waiting for our new house to be completed in Merced when I was appointed to the church there. Most of our belongings were in storage. We lived in a two bedroom furnished apartment with basic kitchen utensils, a few toys and books, a portable stereo, and clothes. It was freeing not to have so much house and yard to tend – but we were also happy to have more space and a yard to enjoy once our home was finished. The experience of simplification was refreshing. At the same time we grew in deep appreciation of all of our rich blessings.


May simplicity help you discover the true meaning of the holy-days we celebrate.


STEWARDSHIP REMINDER


BLESSING OF THANKSGIVING CARDS AND LETTERS







There will only be one Tower Notes in December, Thursday, Dec. 13.




WARM WINTER NIGHTS

It truly was an all-church event with folks involved in preparing meals, cleaning the kitchen, working with children, tutoring students, sleeping overnight, providing food, moving furniture, and more. Robyn Roberts led the effort with her organizational efforts and leadership every night.

Should you like to continue your support of the Winter Nights Shelter, there are two ways to do so.

- 1) Financial donations are most welcome to cover the \$133,000 for six and a half months. Funding has been received to keep the shelter open through mid-December. - 2) Tutors are needed for the beginning learners, middle level students and high school. 2 adults have also asked for help with learning how to read. 


Installation Service for New Bayview District Superintendent




LUMC Youth Ministry Update


All women of the Church are invited to join with the United Methodist Women for a Christmas Luncheon on Thursday, December 6, 2007.

THE CRECHE AROUND THE WORLD




