## SEEDS OF A SOWER

The Christian season of Advent began on Sunday, December 2. Advent includes the four Sundays before Christmas. *Advent* derives from the Latin *adventus*, which means "coming." The season proclaims the comings of the Christ – the birth of Christ which we prepare to celebrate once again; the continual coming of Christ in Word and Spirit; and the coming reign of Christ which we anticipate will reach its fullness in the future.

Advent is a season to prepare ourselves anew for Christ's coming. It is a time for quiet reflection on where we have been experiencing Christ's presence, ways we have missed Christ's coming, and attitudes or behaviors that block God's advent among us. Typical admonitions of the Advent season call us to wake up, watch, pay attention, and listen for God's stirring among us. We are encouraged to evaluate our perceptions and actions and make changes to align ourselves more with God's will and God's way.

Walter J. Burghardt, S.J., offers this image of Advent:

Advent is the season to take the barnacles off my Christian bottom – the obstacles that keep me from being enthusiastic in my faith and hope and love.

too self-centered to love my sisters and brothers like other selves, as Jesus has loved me.

Advent is the season to enthusiastically open our hearts, minds, and spirits; our eyes, ears, and hands to receive the gift of God's Love Child. An evening exercise, perhaps during dinner, might be to ask ourselves, "Where did I witness God's presence today? How did Christ come to me in a most surprising and delightful way? Did I miss an opportunity where Christ might have been present?"

Watch with hope, for Christ indeed is coming to you and in our world.

## **LUMC Church Council Meeting - November 20, 2007**

Attendees: Pat Hershey, Joe Darrell, Dean Coons, Robyn Roberts, Tom Henderson, Carol Slatten, David White, Pastor Lori Sawdon, Ginny Cowden, and Mary Hobson.

Joys and Concerns were shared. Chairperson Pat Hershey led us in prayer. Pat asked if there were any corrections to the minutes. Hearing none, minutes from Oct. 16 were approved as submitted.

## **REPORTS**

<u>Finance</u> - David White, our treasurer, reported that we are going to meet our expenses for this year, and are having a very good year financially, primarily due to non-pledged income.

- •Stewardship Update- Seventy –seven pledges have come in so far for 2008.
- •Pastor Lori reported for Ginny Leavitt who was absent. She said that since Workman's Comp is tied to salaries, the Finance Committee recommends that Joyful Beginnings be responsible for their portion of the Workman's Comp. Bill. Since the bill is paid for 2007, Joyful Beginnings will write off the amount (\$3,500) from the outstanding loan, leaving a balance owed by the church to Joyful of \$3,500. Starting with the 2008 calendar year, Joyful Beginnings will pay for their portion of the Workman's Comp. Bill. In the past, Joyful Beginnings has on their own, raised their monthly contribution to the church for Facilities Use by \$100. The Finance Committee, in appreciation for what Joyful brings to this church, recommends that Joyful's contribution remain at \$1,900 a month. This seems in line with our other revenue. This recommendation was approved by all. Lay Leadership Pastor Lori reported that the committee was unable to find a volunteer to be treasurer, and the Staff Parish committee is now looking for a bookkeeper.

<u>Staff Parish</u> - Staff Parish recommended that we create a new position of bookkeeper who will work 3-5 hours a week and \$800 a month be budgeted for this. Discussion was held. The Treasurer would ideally oversee this bookkeeper. If there is no Treasurer, then the Finance Chr. will do so. Quickbooks will be used to prepare the monthly reports. Joe Darrell seconded, and it was approved. The Staff Parish Committee recommended the use of unbudgeted wages (141 acct.) as a start up in the first month, amounting to \$1,009. Carol Slatten seconded, and all approved.

•Ginny Cowden reported for Staff Parish that the Director of Youth Ministry resigned. We are in the process of forming a Youth Ministry Team. There will also be a transition period before any Youth Ministry person is hired.

<u>Trustees</u> - Joe Darrell reported that the Trustees are discussing a repaving project at the Parsonage. They are looking at about \$13,500, and it may cost more. Accounts 505 and 506 along with 2006 carryover cash were suggested to be used to pay for the project.

**Program Council** - no report

**OLD BUSINESS**— During the week that our church hosted Winter Nights, there were 38 people (21 were children). Robyn reported that they felt safe and happy here, and everything went smoothly. Help from many members, especially Cheen Chow and Judy Stillman was appreciated. We all thanked Robyn for all she did for the program.

#### **NEW BUSINESS-** none

Pat Hershey moved we adjourn the meeting at 8:40. The next meeting will be a joint meeting with the Finance Committee on Dec. 11 at 7:00. Annual Church Conference will be at 4:00 on Dec. 2<sup>nd</sup>.
