As we begin this new year, I share with you three simple rules designed by John Wesley for the people called Methodists.


- 1. Do No Harm, avoiding evil of every kind.



PRAY The Bible



"THE PIRATES WHO DON'T DO ANYTHING"



The stoles worn around the neck remind us of the yoke that Jesus invited his disciples to take upon themselves. "Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me" (Matthew 11:29a). Worship leaders, including the choir, acolytes, and pastor, wear the stoles as a reminder that they are servants of Jesus. The colors represent the various church seasons: White in Christmas and Easter; Green for Epiphany and Ordinary Days; Purple for Advent and Lent; and Red for Pentecost




FEBRUARY FOOD BASKET





LUMC Church Council Meeting - Dec. 11, 2007

Attendees: Pastor Lori Sawdon, Dean Coons, Carol Slatten, Doug Cowden, Robyn Roberts, Joe Darrell, Pat Hershey, Tom Henderson, Jack Cotteral, Mary Hobson.

REPORTS

<u>Finance</u> - Robyn Roberts moved that the budget submitted by Finance Committee be approved by the Church Council. Doug Cowden seconded. All approved. A copy of the 2008 budget as approved is attached.

The Finance Committee also recommended that the following end of year expenditure priorities be set:

- 1. Trustee Funds: If budgeted Trustees monies from 2007 are not spent by year end, move these funds to Trustees 900 Account for 2008
- 2. Unpaid Apportionments (Approximately \$23,670)
- 3. UMPIP (Approximately \$950) Make a Discretionary Employer Contribution to the UMPIP on behalf of all eligible employees, of 2% of salary. If funds are insufficient to make a contribution on behalf of all eligible employees, make a contribution on behalf of all employees who themselves contributed during 2007, up to a maximum of 2% of salary.
- 4. Askings (Approximately \$8,214)
- 5. Any Additional Funds Carry Over to 2008

Joe Darrell seconded. All approved.

<u>Trustees</u> - Joe told us about the work being done on repaving of the Parsonage driveway, garage floor and patio. Greg Horner and Mason Walter planned and helped with getting contractors for the project. The trustees helped empty the garage. Joe said that trustees will work on a new slate of officers in January. Church Council members expressed appreciation for all that the trustees, led by Joe, have done this year.

<u>Staff Parish</u> - A team was recruited to interview people for the position of bookkeeper. The Staff Parish Committee met with the new District Superintendent, Rev. Renae Extrum-Fernandez, on Dec. 2nd, before the Annual Church Conference. <u>Lay Leadership</u> - Doug Cowden has agreed to be the new Endowment Chair.

<u>Program Council</u> - Carol Slatten reported that the Creche Display was enjoyed by all who attended. Attendance was low on Saturday, but many came after church on Sunday. She recommended however, that we not do it too often due to the amount of effort, and relatively low interest. Pat said it was spectacular, and much appreciated.

Pat reported that we received the Treasurer's Report, and finances seem to be in good order.

Old Business- none New Business-none

Pat thanked all who participated on the Council and said that the next Council Meeting would be on January 22. The meeting was adjourned at 8:25.
