SEEDS OF A SOWER

During the season of Lent we will catch a glimpse of the experiences biblical characters had with Jesus in the gospel of John. Their lives were transformed by their relationship with Jesus. Jesus comes to transform our lives as well. We are invited to ever deepening relationships with Jesus. Frequently it is difficult for us to put our faith into words. We can "walk the talk," but we are hesitant to "talk the walk," to witness to our faith, to share our "God moments," to tell others how Jesus makes a difference in our lives.

In a recent message I encouraged us to consider our own faith stories during the season of Lent. These are the ideas I suggested for pondering our own experiences of God's presence in our lives:

List significant people, events, and experiences in our lives.

Search for trends or patterns among them and ask how God was active in these.

What is our understanding of our relationship with Christ?

What theological concepts have been illumined by our life experience?

What commitments have we made as a result of our faith?

Has a sense of Christian vocation developed?

What has contributed to maturity and growth in our spiritual life?

A practice we might try during the season of Lent is a daily exercise called the Examen of Consciousness. It helps us become aware of God's presence in our lives. Near the end of each day, pause for about five minutes of quiet and ask ourselves two questions:

For what moment today am I most grateful?

For what moment today am I least grateful?

There are many other ways to ask the same questions:

When did I give and receive the most love today?

When did I give and receive the least love today?

When did I feel most alive today?

When did I feel life draining out of me?

When today did I have the greatest sense of belonging to myself, others, God, and the universe?

When did I have the least sense of belonging?

May we grow in our consciousness of Christ's love and God's presence in our daily lives.

LENT AND EASTER TRIVIA

Until the 4th century CE, Easter and Pentecost were the only two holy days that Christians observed. Easter Sunday was the main day of celebration, formally recognized by the *Council of Nicea* in 325 CE. Pentecost Sunday was also observed as a less important holy day, 7 weeks/49 days after Easter. Other occasions related to Jesus' execution were gradually added to the church calendar.

Lent is a period of spiritual preparation for Easter which traditionally emphasized fasting, penance, and prayer. It was originally established by various Christian groups as an interval ranging from a few days to several weeks. It was eventually fixed in the 8th century CE at 40 days. The number 40 is one of many symbolic numbers with religious significance in the Bible. Jesus, Moses, and Elijah each spent 40 days in the desert. Among Roman Catholic and Protestant Christians, Lent lasts for six and a half weeks, before Easter, excluding Sundays, which are "little Easters." Among the Eastern Orthodox churches, it is a full eight weeks, because Saturdays and Sundays are not included.

Easter Sunday falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon after March 20, the nominal date of the Spring Equinox. Easter Sunday can fall on any date from March 22 to April 25. The year-to-year sequence is so complicated that it takes 5.7 million years to repeat. The next time that Easter will fall on March 22, the very earliest date possible, will be 2285! If the date of Easter does not follow Passover, Eastern Orthodox churches delay their Easter—sometimes by over a month. The season of Easter lasts 49 days, ending with the celebration of Pentecost on the 50th day after Easter Sunday.



# Lafayette United Methodist Church Church Council Meeting - January 15, 2008

**Present:** Chairperson Pat Hershey, Pastor Lori Sawdon, Robyn Roberts, Carol Slatten, Pat Porter, Jack Cotteral, Tom Henderson, Ginny Cowden, and Secretary Kurt Teichmann

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 by Chairperson Pat Hershey, who gave a prayer of thankfulness. She noted that to save paper, the final Church Council ("CC") Minutes would today, and henceforth, not be distributed at the CC Meetings because they had already been distributed to CC members. The minutes of the December 11, 2007 meeting were approved unanimously.

**Lay Leadership Report** -No specific report. The Committee has several positions to fill. **Finance Committee Report** - Carol Slatten distributed the December financial reports as prepared by David White. Carol noted that 2007 Total Income was \$50,000+ over budget! December income alone was \$10,000+ over budget. Total Church income for the year was \$379,296. Carol noted that Members' Pledges were \$8,000 below budget but that Non-Pledged Givings were approximately \$39,000 above budget.

•Carol noted proudly that all 2007 apportionments and askings had been paid. There was a carryover of approximately \$30,000 to 2008. In addition, the Christmas offering exceeded the budgeted outreach amount by approximately \$1,700; the Finance Committee approved applying the excess to pay some small 2008 apportionments that qualified as outreach. The position of Treasurer is unfilled.

**Staff Parish Relations Committee Report -** SPRC Chairman Pat Porter reported that organist Royetta Rule had given her notice to leave effective January 13<sup>th</sup>. SPRC has placed an ad in an organist's newsletter. The process to find a replacement is underway.

- •The Church has engaged a bookkeeper, Toni Hessler, on a contract basis. The cost of her expected 5 hours/week is included in the 2008 budget.
- •SPRC has reaffirmed the salary increase to our Director of Music as previously approved.

**Program Council Report -** Pastor Lori reported that Teresa Gerringer has penciled in December 12-14 for the Bethlehem Experience.

**Trustees Committee Report -** No report as a new Chairman will not be elected until the Trustees' 1/28 meeting. Most importantly, the Maggie Mae Lounge is not leaking. Joe Darrell was given some credit in this regard.

Old Business - None. New Business - None.

**Communications -** Chairperson Hershey said that Lafayette Downtown Strategy was trying to be pro-active about planning for the City. Pastor Lori said that she has been invited to interview with City leaders on 1/25. She felt that she would be representing the church and so wanted to know what CC would suggest. It was agreed that increased parking and improved traffic flow were important. Jack Cotteral said that

more senior housing, especially near the church, was desirable. The consensus was that Pastor Lori should also talk to young families to learn of their priorities for Lafayette.

Lafayette will hold its 2/12 Community Workshop in our Fellowship Hall. Pastor Lori has offered to have the meeting hosted by the church in our Fellowship Hall. The Council considered this a chance to have new people visit our church as an opportunity.

The next meeting will be on 2/19. Chairperson Hershey said that it could be a combined meeting with the Finance Committee.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:30.
