SEEDS OF A SOWER

Recently the question was posed to me by a longtime Methodist: "When did we start calling clergy 'pastors'? We used to call them 'ministers'." I could not give a specific date, but I used the opportunity as a teaching moment!

In the past fifteen or twenty years, the United Methodist Church has been intentional about reclaiming the ministry of all Christians. A few Christians are set apart for specific ministries of Word, Sacrament, Order, and Service. These are those who are called by God and recognized by the church for ordained ministry. I have received that call, responded to it, and had the call affirmed by the church (in a rigorous process of examination!). However, that does not mean that I am the only minister of the church.

Jesus calls all Christians to share the Good News of God's great love. Each of us has unique gifts which we are called to use in the service of Christ.

Our United Methodist *Book of Discipline* says, "The heart of Christian ministry is Christ's ministry of outreaching love. Christian ministry is the expression of the mind and mission of Christ **by a community of Christians** that demonstrates a common life of gratitude and devotion, witness and service, celebration and discipleship. **All Christians are called through their baptism to this ministry of servanthood** in the world to the glory of God and for human fulfillment."

The word "pastor" evokes images of a shepherd tending a flock, offering guidance and providing nourishment. The ordained minister/pastor is called to equip the congregation with spiritual sustenance and with skills to be in ministry to the world. The pastor isn't the only one in ministry. As ministers all, a congregation has a far greater outreach to the community and the world.

During the past few months many members of our congregation have suffered greatly and been in need of care and compassion. We have and continue to experience several transitions in leadership. I have focused my pastoral care on families in the midst of crisis. I have entrusted the care of church family members to the community for you to visit, call, send cards, and express Christ's love. I have focused my administrative leadership in areas undergoing transition. More stable areas of the church life have received less of my attention. I am grateful for your partnership in this way. We are the church together. I depend on the offering of your gifts in order for the full potential of Christ's ministry among us to be realized.

LUMC CHURCH COUNCIL & CHARGE CONFERENCE MINUTES FEBRUARY 19, 2008

Members attending: Pat Porter, Dave Inglis, Tom Henderson, Mason Walters and Corinne Roberts, representing Trustees, Carol Slatten, Dean Coons, Ginny Cowden, Lori Sawdon, Jack Cotteral, Doug Cowden, Pat Hershey, and Ginny Leavitt. Also in attendance: Carol Lu Zischke

Pat Hershey, Chair, convened the Church Council meeting at 7:50 p.m. with Joys and Concerns, and Prayers. The minutes as distributed by email were considered approved. Jack requested that the Final Minutes be labeled "Final" before distribution. A few moments were spent on Church Life -- "How are we doing 'experiencing and expressing Christ's Love'?" It was suggested that we need a better way of recognizing new people in our congregation.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance -- Ginny L. reported that we are nearly finished with the transition of our bookkeeping procedures. Toni Hessler, newly hired bookkeeper, is working to be familiar with our needs and how best to meet them. Reports may look slightly different. Finance Committee will be evaluating these and may request changes. Ginny, as Chair, will meet at least monthly with Toni before the Finance Committee meetings. Ginny distributed the Profit and Loss Statements as well as the Balance Sheet. The Church finances are in very good shape for the beginning of the year, especially the cash flow. This is in part due to some prepaid pledges, but mainly to a very large rollover from 2007 (\$33,000+) and that was available after paying all our 2007 apportionments and askings. Finance will be working on the description/accounting of the Designated Funds on our Balance Sheet (900s) for better description and utilization of these funds. The Committee is looking for a new auditor, located in our area. Trustees -- Randall Husch is the newly elected chair of the Trustees, but because of family emergencies was unable to attend the meeting. Representing the trustees was Mason Walters, vice-chair, and Corinne Roberts, secretary. Trustees had a recent walk-thru of the church facilities and have begun a priority list to focus their attention. First priority is cleaning the gutters, particularly in the Education Building. That should

be completed soon. In gardening needs they are listing some "near term" goals, such as adding color to our grounds, as well as "long term" goals, such as the courtyard paving. They want to do some preliminary planning, get some costs estimates, and set aside some funds. Other priorities are furnace needs, particularly Fellowship Hall, and the parsonage sprinkler system.

SPRC -- Pat Porter reported that a new organist has been hired. Ken Mansfield, who played for the Feb. 17 service, has accepted our offer, and it was within our budgeted amount.

Lay Leadership – Pastor Lori reported that an informal poll of the committee indicated a willingness conduct an orientation meeting for new constituents to assist in their welcome and integration.

Pat adjourned the Church Council Meeting at 8:30, then reconvened us as a Charge Conference, as approved by the District Superintendent. Pastor Lori conducted the meeting, for the sole purpose of electing a trustee to fill a vacant position in the class of 2008. Chen Yin Noah was unanimously elected. The Charge Conference was adjourned at 8:35 p.m.

The next Church Council meeting will be March 18 at the regularly scheduled time of 7:30 p.m.
