

# Welcome our New Organist!

Ken Mansfield joins our staff on March 24 as our Organist. A native Californian born in King City, Ken studied piano in San Diego from age eleven through high school. While a student at Harvard, he continued private piano study under Heinrich Gebhard. He holds B.A. and M.A. degrees in music from Harvard, where studies in theory and composition were done under Randall Thompson and Walter Piston. In his junior year he began private organ studies and upon completion of the Master's degree, he was awarded a two-year Traveling Fellowship in Europe by the Harvard Music Department. While in Europe organ studies continued under Sir William McKie in London, Andre Marchal in Paris, and Edward Mueller in Basel.

During his career in Northern California, Ken has served as organist for Episcopal and Lutheran Churches. He was the organist at Lafayette-Orinda Presbyterian Church for 34 years, where he coordinated the building of the organ. He is Professor Emeritus at California State University, Hayward, where he taught in the Music Department from 1966 to 1995. He is a past Dean of the San Francisco Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. Compositions include words for organ, choir, piano, and solo voice.


Acceptable items FREE to recycle:
