SEEDS OF A SOWER

I pray that you, like me, are still basking in the joy of Easter Sunday morning. The powerful story of resurrection is inspiring in itself, but this community of faith embodies the spirit of the risen Christ in ways that make the story come alive among us. I am grateful for your generous participation in providing for the Easter brunch, the garden setting, the music, the Easter egg hunt, the Easter lilies, and a joyous worship celebration.

In coming weeks the United Methodist Church will likely be making news headlines. 2008 is the year of our quadrennial General Conference, to be held April 23-May 2 in Fort Worth, Texas. The General Conference is composed of up to 1,000 lay and clergy delegates representing United Methodists from around the world. The theme is "A Future with Hope."

General Conference is the only body that officially speaks for the United Methodist Church. Delegates revise *The Book of Discipline* and *The Book of Resolutions*, which contains more than 300 statements of the church's stance on social justice issues. Delegates also approve plans and budgets for church-wide programs for the next four years.

This year marks the 40th anniversary of the creation of the United Methodist Church, formed by a merger of the Evangelical United Brethren Church and the Methodist Church.

United Methodists from outside the United States will be more visible than ever at General Conference 2008. Of the 992 delegates, 278 (29% of the total) will come from outside the U.S., representing the global nature of our denomination. Nigeria and North Katanga (in the Democratic Republic of the Congo) conferences will send the two larges delegations. President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf of Liberia will address the assembly April 29. In the past decade, church membership in Africa has increased by 244 percent, to 3.1 million members. We are growing in Eastern Europe and the former Soviet bloc nations, and among Korean Americans and other ethnic groups in the United States.

For the first time a young person's address has been added to the conference schedule. Six young people will give a presentation on the first full day of General Conference. This is part of an intention effort to embrace young people in the denomination. The average United Methodist is 57 years old. United Methodists under age 18 account for 4.6 percent of church membership. The number of ordained and commissioned elders under age 35 is a mere 850 in the U.S.

I'll be sharing more about General Conference in future issues and in worship. Please add to your prayer list the delegates to General Conference and the bishops, including our Bishop Beverly Shamana, who will be presiding. Let us pray for a spirit of unity in the denomination, and discernment and energy for the participants.


