SEEDS OF A SOWER

As a bibliophile, I like to read lists of summer reading recommendations. Unfortunately I read far more lists than I do books! I thought I'd share some of my recent reads, books inspiring for people of faith. I'm happy to share my copies. I'd also welcome your recommendations.

The Soloist: A Lost Dream, an Unlikely Friendship, and the Redemptive Power of Music, by Steve Lopez. Los Angeles Times reporter Steve Lopez befriends a homeless musician suffering from mental illness. Mr. Lopez persists in his effort to restore Mr. Ayers, a former Julliard student, to health and wholeness, although the journey is long and continues even as the book concludes. I appreciated the insights into the homeless with mental illness; some who choose to live "on the streets" often do so because they have been mistreated by "the system."

The Lemon Tree: An Arab, A Jew, and the Heart of the Middle East, by Sandy Tolan of Cal's Graduate School of Journalism. This is the story of a Palestinian family who fled their home in 1948 during the Arab-Israeli war. Their house became the home of a Jewish family who fled Europe following the Holocaust. The author tells the stories of the two families and their eventual meeting, set in the larger context of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. The book is especially timely in light of the 60th anniversary of the founding of Israel.

Amish Grace: How Forgiveness Transcended Tragedy, by Donald Kraybill, Steven Nolt, and David Weaver-Zercher. Our nation was horrified by the shooting of ten schoolgirls at Nickel Mines, Pennsylvania in October 2006. Then we were stunned by the Amish community's collective and radical act of forgiveness toward the shooter and his family. This book probes the roots of the Amish culture and the profound faith that leads them to offer forgiveness. A helpful distinction is made between two types of forgiveness: decisional and emotional.
