SEEDS OF A SOWER

At a recent meeting of the Board of Regents of the University of the Pacific, I was asked to offer a closing word of inspiration. A few minutes prior the Investment Committee had just reported on our significant losses. During the week many of my colleagues on the Board had been anxiously checking their PDAs for the latest news from Congress and the stock market. Several of their businesses were suffering the impact of the economic crisis hitting the nation. I realized that while their businesses were in turmoil, my business has the opportunity to thrive, for we are in the business of faith and hope.

I shared a story about Winston Churchill. In 1945 he unbelievably lost the election in England and became extremely depressed. His wife, Clementine, tried to comfort him, saying it was probably a "blessing in disguise." Churchill replied, "If it is a blessing, it is very well disguised."

The blessings of our nation's current financial crisis are still well disguised. My hope is that we will be reawakened to what is truly of value in the lives we have been given. It is an opportunity for us, on multiple levels – personal, community, corporate, national – to evaluate our priorities and values. We may rediscover the wisdom of Jesus who teaches that the meaning of life is found in loving God, loving our neighbor, as well as caring for ourselves. Fulfilling these commands does not require the material and financial wealth that our culture tends to tout as the source of "the good life."

The Chinese symbol for crisis can mean either danger or opportunity. The outcome is highly dependent upon our response to crisis. While we must be wise and prudent in our financial dealings, we are also people of faith. Our faith is the ultimate foundation of our lives. When everything else is in turmoil around us, people of faith continue to know that the richer blessings of life are found in relationship – relationship with God, with one another, and with the wondrous creation God has designed.


Cherish the blessings given you, for they are found in small and large ways all around us each and every day.




WINTER NIGHTS SUPPORT




#### A Closer Look at Dr. Laura, On Target or Off the Wall? By Tom Allen


#### WELCOME OUR NEW MEMBERS
