Peanuts: Here's to You, America! By Charles M. Schulz

Travel back in time with Peanuts! It's 1787, and Charlie Brown, Snoopy, and friends are in colonial Pennsylvania for the founding of the United States. Along with George Washington and John Hancock, they witness the birth of the Constitution and the creation of the government that makes our country unique. As they see history in the making, the Peanuts gang discovers lots of reasons why they're proud to be Americans

Whose Holy City? Jerusalem and the Future of peace in the Middle East by Colin Chapman

Three religions have fought over Jerusalem for centuries. Jews honor Jerusalem because its Temple housed the presence of God. Christians come to Jerusalem to worship where Jesus Christ was crucified and raised from the dead. Muslims value the city because of its role in 1,400 years of Islamic history.

All three religions feel a strong spiritual attachment to the city and desire unrestricted access to it. Who, though, should have sovereignty? Who should have political control? And who should claim ownership of the Old City, where the most sacred of sites are located?

In Whose Holy City? Colin Chapman assesses the centrality of Jerusalem in the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, traces the city's history from Old Testament times to the contemporary scene, and shows how the issues of the past are relevant today. Jerusalem is regarded by many as a key, if not the key, to peace in the Middle East. If Jerusalem could be addressed and resolved in a way that is acceptable to the majority on all sides, it might point the way to a resolution of the whole conflict.

The Hope of the Nation That Prays, How to Pray for America, by Don Nori

Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord (Psalm 33:12) America is worth saving. God's purpose for America is far from complete. Prayer is not merely the last recourse of the weak, as some suggest. You are not helpless during times of crisis, either national or personal. In this book you will find hope and courage to pray to a God who loves you and wants to answer your prayers.

This is an interdenominational event, with one-fourth of the proceeds designated for the Winter Nights program. We thank the LUMC members who sponsored Chris and Dean. With the help of other friends, our contribution totaled \$436. The nearly 100 walkers raised almost \$12,000 for aid to the hungry and homeless.

Endowment Committee Report

Walter and Virginia Hoadley have generously given the Lafayette United Methodist Church \$97,101.88 in a Charitable Remainder Trust. They were active long time members and were always generous supporters of our church. An article in the San Francisco Chronicle on Thursday, March 13, 2003 after Walter's death gives us an insight to the Hoadley's life.

Mr. Hoadley was chief economist and executive vice president of the Bank of America in San Francisco and served on numerous boards. In addition, he was a senior economist at Federal Reserve banks in Chicago and Philadelphia and was a regent of the University of California.

A frequent public speaker, he was president of the Commonwealth Club of California in 1987 and was a regular commentator for Fox television in San Francisco.

He was born in San Francisco and received his bachelor's degree, master's degree and a Ph.D. from UC Berkeley and remained an active alumnus of the Class of '38. May 18, 2001 was declared Walter Hoadley Day in San Francisco.

"We met in our first class at Berkeley," said Virginia Hoadley, his wife of nearly 64 years. "It was in chemistry class. It was pretty much love at first sight. I saw a fine and sincere person."

The two dated for five years before marrying. Their daughter, Jean Hoadley Peterson died Sept. 11 2001 when United Airlines Flight 93, hijacked by terrorists, crashed near Johnstown, Pa.

Virginia Hoadley said the two traveled extensively and attended prayer breakfasts with Presidents Jimmy Carter and Ronald Regan. She said she accompanied her husband to Japan at least 17 times. "It's been a wonderful life together," she said.
