LAFAYETTE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH Church Council Minutes – Tues., Oct. 21, 2008

MEMBERS Present: Greg Horner, Dean Coons, Pat Porter, Pastor Lori, Pat Hershey, Tom Henderson, Doug Cowden, Ginny Cowden, Carol Slatten, Ginny Leavitt

At 7:32 p.m. the meeting was called to order by Chair Pat Hershey with Joys and Concerns, and an opening prayer. The minutes of the September meeting have not yet been finalized.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Finance: Ginny Leavitt reminded all that the Bookkeeper was on vacation, thus there would be no Financial Report. However, she felt that we were in good shape based on the Sunday Receipt reports. Finance Committee submitted a request for an exception to the Endowment Policy. After much discussion, the request was tabled until the next Council meeting so that there could be more input from the Endowment Committee. Also at that time, it was asked that we clarify the difference between "memorials" and "bequests". We should also consider if it is time to evaluate the Endowment Policy. The goal of Council will be to review/revise if necessary/approve the Policy.

- ••Ginny reported that there had been two Stewardship letters sent out. It is hoped that all pledges will be in by November 2. It is the intent of the Finance Comm. to submit a balanced budget by All Church Conference. The committee requested a November meeting change with Finance meeting on Nov. 4, and Council on Nov. 11 for this purpose.
- ••Ginny displayed the Julia White created Holiday Boutique/Traditional Tea flyer, and asked people to take one if they knew some place it could be posted. She encouraged

the Council to give their support and plan to attend. It was recommended that Julia email a PDF to Paul Welcomer for posting on our Website.

••Finance submitted the following policy for adoption by Council:

"The Church will only reimburse expenses if reimbursement vouchers are submitted within the calendar year in which the expenses are incurred, except that reimbursement vouchers for expenses incurred in December may be submitted up until January 15 of the following year." (Cowden, D, Cowden, G) Motion carried.

Trustees: (Greg Horner reporting) Greg reported that they have appointed a Courtyard Comm. of Ray Peters, Mason Walters, Chen Yin Noah, Robyn Roberts, Randall Husch, with Alistair Shearer, consulting. The uneven spots in the courtyard have been ground down as a temporary fix. The All Church Clean-up Day is Nov. 1. Trustees are looking into insulation in the Education Building. The parking lot lights are working. The painting in the nursery has been done. The church and preschool were inspected by the Fire Marshall this week, and the kitchen hood and duct system needs to be redone by Jan. 23, 2009. This is an unplanned expense.

SPRC: Pat Porter reported on the requests that had been submitted to Finance for budgeting purposes. There was discussion about the need for a Youth Director, as we greatly value the youth program within our church.

Lay Leadership: Pastor Lori reported that the committee continues to work on the slate to present at All Church Conference.

Program Council: Pastor Lori highlighted Winter Nights, in progress with great participation, Bethlehem Experience, planning underway, and the Youth's open invitation for their Halloween Party.

There was no Old Business to come before the Council.

New Business: Ginny Leavitt gave the annual Joyful Beginnings Preschool report. Joyful finished its 13th year in the black, although it was a tighter year with slightly less than anticipated enrollment, and unbudgeted expenses (bookkeeper and worker's comp). This year is off to a good start with better enrollment, just one under what was anticipated and one more staff member then previously. Ginny pointed out that Joyful is our largest contributor in facilities use, but also helps financially in other ways that benefit the church and its programs. The interest free loan given the church when it fell short of expenses for the painting project is nearly paid off by writing off a \$100 a month.

Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations discussion was postponed.

Communications: Dean Coons said the forms for reservations to the Chamber of Commerce Thanksgiving Breakfast at Temple Isaiah are available. The Interfaith Thanksgiving Service will be held at Our Saviors Church this year.

Pat Hershey adjourned the meeting at 9:10 p.m. with a reminder that the next Council meeting will be on Tuesday, November 11.
