

"Seven Reasons Why You Can Trust the Bible" by Edwin W. Lutzer (theologian, frequent radio host, and award-winning author)


"I have a friend who says he saw a beautiful house standing opposite ERWIN W.LUTZER Mont Blanc on the border between France and Switzerland. What puzzled him was that the shutters on the windows that faced that beautiful mountain were always closed. No matter how remarkable the Bible is, it will not have an appeal to those who refuse to give it an honest hearing. At the end of the day, whether we believe it or not depends on whether we are willing to "fling the shutters open and see what is before us." Professor Lutzer's book is ideally written and organized for group study as well as individual reading. The breadth and depth of his scriptural and historical references make it best suited to those who have a little Bible background.
