SEEDS OF A SOWER

On May 19, Church Council, in consultation with the Worship Committee, decided to discontinue the 8:30 worship service as of June 1, due to rapidly declining worship attendance. Beginning in June we will offer one worship service at 10:30 a.m. Our average attendance at 8:30 has gradually declined over the past two years from 25 to 12, including two staff members. It is difficult to offer passionate worship and inspiring music with so few singers! We are concerned about the impression such a small group makes upon first time visitors who may not know that this is indeed a vital, dynamic congregation!!

The 8:30 service was originally started several years ago as a contemporary worship service to offer an alternative style to the traditional service. It has not been a contemporary style for at least nine years, more an informal, shortened version of the 10:30 service.

Although the ending of the 8:30 service feels like a loss, every end brings the opportunity for new beginnings. We are surveying the congregation (one enclosed) to evaluate our Sunday morning schedule and determine the best time for one worship service. One service will allow us to more easily schedule Adult Education and Spiritual Growth Opportunities on Sunday morning.

There has been discussion in the past five years about offering a truly alternative style of worship. This will require an investment of musical talent, staff guidance, and volunteers to assist with a variety of ministries: multimedia technology, music, drama, etc. It is an idea to prayerfully consider as we are called by our denomination to "Rethink Church" with regard to how we can be in ministry with young adults 18-34 years of age.

As people of faith, we trust that God is making all things new. Let us await with hope for the new life God is bringing to birth among us.

Classes (preschool-5th grades) will continue through the end of June with our regular teachers planning different activities to learn about the Word of God and how it applies to everyday life.




Wedding Anniversary Celebration

The Way of Prayer Makes a Difference


