LUMC Youth Ministry Update

LUMC has a rich tradition of vital youth ministry that has made a significant impact on the lives of many young people. We are in the midst of transition as one chapter of our youth ministry closes and a new chapter begins. Here's what's happening.

Where We've Been

Judy Stillman has long been an integral member LUMC's youth ministry. Her gift for working with teens and organizational skills has enabled the congregation to long depend upon Judy to direct all dimensions of the youth ministry.

For three years Judy has spoken to Pastor Lori of her desire to transition out of youth ministry. This request has been shared with Staff Parish Relations Committee, who has responsibility for staff positions in the life of the congregation. In response to Judy's request, attempts were made to hire a new Director of Youth Ministry, but none of those were long-term relationships.

Among the lessons from those experiences is that the church lacked a solid support structure of adult leaders to sustain the youth ministry and support the Director of Youth Ministry. One person alone cannot direct, coordinate, recruit volunteers, and lead programs, especially in a mere 10 hours a week.

In November 2007, a Youth Ministry Team was formed with Teresa Gerringer as the convener. Youth and adults were invited to be a part of the team to facilitate the youth ministry program. Judy agreed to be a coach on the team, sharing the wisdom of her experience over the years while training others to take on responsibilities.

In the fall of 2008, Judy announced to the youth that it would be her final year of youth ministry. Over the year she would phase out, decreasing her responsibilities from coach to cheerleader to spectator.

As a new school year begins, Judy is moving on to lead adult small groups for our church family. A celebration of Judy's ministry with the youth is being planned for the Thanksgiving weekend. We are grateful for her generous and able service to our youth over the years.

The New Chapter Begins

This Fall of 2009, the oversight of the various aspects of the Youth Ministry falls under the **Youth Ministry Team** – youth group, Sunday school, confirmation, and Sierra Service Project. Active members of the Youth Ministry Team are:

The team was led in a visioning retreat in June by the CA-NV Conference Director of Young Peoples Ministries, Kelly Newell. Additional adults with an interest in youth ministry also attended the retreat: Beth White, Mark VandenBerghe, Lynn Sabatini, and Greg Horner. The team has been guided by *Sustainable Youth Ministry: Why most youth ministry doesn't last and what your church can do about it*, by Mark DeVries.

The Youth Ministry Team recognizes the need for young adults who can relate to the teen culture to be faith mentors and role models for our youth. It also recognizes the need for a solid support structure of volunteers to manage the operations of the youth ministry. Our primary goal at this time is building the infrastructure to support the ministry. Volunteers will continue to provide the ministry. We are working to equip volunteers for their service.

It Takes a Village

Ministries are always enhanced when they are team based. There are multitudes of ways in which you can participate in youth ministry:

- share a talent, skill or hobby of interest;
- share the gift of music;
- lead recreational games;
- suggest or lead us in a service project;
- integrate youth into other areas of the church life;


Experiencing Christ's Love through Worship September Theme: The Leading Causes of Life

Each year in the fall, LUMC conducts a stewardship campaign to be able to have a sense of our expected income for budgeting purposes for the following year. Two thirds of our income is from pledges/giving. The remainder is from use of our buildings, fundraisers, special giving, etc. This income funds everything that we do at our church – our staff/administration and related expenses, our apportionments /outreach, our building maintenance/ insurance/taxes /utilities, our programs. Etc. It is through your generous giving that we have been able to maintain all that we do even in these tough economic times!
