Seeds of A Sower

Recently the *Contra Costa Times* "Religion & Ethics" page had an article titled, "Clergy look to Web for sermon inspiration." The pastor interviewed said that of the 38 weeks he preaches a year, he has original ideas for half. The other half he finds on the Internet, taking what other preachers have done and tweaking it for his congregation. It is true that you can find a multitude of ready-made messages on the Internet, some for free, others for a fee.

The article prompts me to share with you the process I use in preaching. During the summer I planned my message themes through Easter. Throughout the year, I seek to offer a variety: biblical interpretation, Christian beliefs, spiritual practices and growth, pastoral care, and enhancement of the church. The current, *Leading Signs of Life*, was inspired by the title of a book, but it is not a book of sermons. The month of October will focus on United Methodism, some history, our beliefs, and our global mission. In November we'll explore the book of Job. For the season of Advent, the theme is from a favorite Christmas carol, "The Hopes and Fears," based upon scripture readings from the lectionary, a three year cycle of readings covering 70% of the Bible. In the new year, I'll offer a series, "Goldmines for Growth," focusing on the challenges of life that present opportunities for our personal growth. During Lent we'll visit biblical stories telling of encounters with Jesus to consider our own relationship with Jesus.

In preparing I start with the scripture or scriptures related to the specific theme. I discern the message from scripture that God has for people in our time and context. I reflect on the message during the week, consulting a wide variety of resources: prayer, Bible commentaries, journals, books, and yes, the Internet! I've annotated many of the books I've read, filing items for later use and I make notes throughout the week. Thursday, Friday, and Saturday hopefully it all coalesces in a meaningful message to inspire the discipleship of the people.

Preparing a message is a spiritual process that ideally takes 15-20 hours per week, usually in bites of 15 minutes to 3 hours of time. Although I may read or listen to sermons of other preachers, I do not just tweak their ready-made material. I use an illustration or take a point or idea from another, but never an entire message. Integrity is an honorable value for me. I am responsible for what I preach, so it must be of me and relevant to the current time and context. I very rarely use a sermon I have previously preached. I've grown since then, the time and setting are different, and God is still speaking.

God's Word is fresh every morning! May you be inspired and challenged by the fresh Word of God!



Each year in the fall, LUMC conducts a stewardship campaign to be able to have a sense of our expected income for budgeting purposes for the following year. Two thirds of our income is from pledges/giving. The remainder is from use of our buildings, fundraisers, special giving, etc. This income funds everything that we do at our church – our staff/administration and related expenses, our apportionments /outreach, our building maintenance/insurance/taxes /utilities, our programs. Etc. It is through your generous giving that we have been able to maintain all that we do even in these tough economic times!

This year we are using the "Pony Express" rather than "snail mail" to get the pledge/giving cards to you. This means that each of you can be a "rider" and help deliver the mail for LUMC (We realize this would be difficult for the some of you with health issues or living in outlying areas, so we will still rely on the US Postal Service for you.) For the rest of you, I hope you will join in the spirit and pass the saddle bags on to a church neighbor. The process is a simple procedure – and directions will be readily available. Should you not be able to participate during the run, (mid to late October) early pledges will be cheerfully accepted, and your name will be crossed off of your trail boss' list.


