CHILI RECIPE BY REQUEST Ginny Leavitt's Chili Serves 4-5

BASIC RECIPE

Brown 1 # ground beef with onion and garlic Add 1 – (15 oz) can of beans (kidney) Add 1 (15 oz) can of tomatoes (diced, stewed) Chili powder to taste

LUMC CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES October 20, 2009

Present: Dean Coons, Jack Cotteral, Doug Cowden, Ginny Cowden, Tom Henderson, Pat Hershey, David Inglis, Ginny Leavitt, Pat Porter, Robyn Roberts, Pastor Lori Sawdon, Carol Slatten

Pat Hershey, Chair, opened the meeting at 7:30 p.m. Joys and concerns were shared and Ginny Leavitt announced that almost \$3500 had been raised by the silent auction. She thanked all who contributed. After leading the group in prayer, Pat declared the September minutes approved as circulated by email.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance -- Ginny announced that the conversion from Toni to Jill Shibuya went smoothly. Toni will continue to be the bookkeeper for Joyful Beginnings and submit the payroll taxes for both Joyful and LUMC. The Financial Summary for September was distributed. Pledged income continues to be under expectations and research by Lorri Sullivan shows that \$1100 will not be received due to the deaths of the pledgers. The remaining \$5700 will probably be received. Use of church continues to be above expectations. Expenses are under expended. The financial picture continues to be positive and much as expected. It's time for eScript to be renewed by all.

Trustees -- In the absence of Randall Husch, Pastor Lori announced that the Fire Marshall's list of must-fixes is almost complete and that the fire suppression system has been installed in the kitchen. LUMC is now waiting for the Fire Marshall's final inspection.

SPRC -- Pat Porter reported that the Staff-Parish Relations Committee was proposing a 2% Merit Increase for Pastor Lori Sawdon. After some discussion, Carol Slatten seconded the proposal and the vote in favor was unanimous. The Pastor's salary must be set in advance of the general church budget and must now be voted on at the Church Conference November 15th. Pat reported that the Youth Team structure is in place and a St. Mary's student has indicated a desire to intern with the group. A job description is being worked on. There will be a celebration of Judy Stillman's youth ministry on November 29th.

Nominations and Leadership Development – Pastor Lori and her committee are actively recruiting volunteers with mixed results. The change in the name of the committee was noted.

OLD BUSINESS -- none

NEW BUSINESS -- Pastor Lori was contacted by a local company with a Sacred Space columbarium proposal - the Council ordered that the information be forwarded to the trustees with no recommendation. The Lafayette Farmer's Market has asked for parking from May 2010 though September 2010. Doug Cowden moved and David Ingles seconded that their request be approved for another year. Carried unanimously. Dean Coons moved and Doug Cowden seconded that the Contra Costa Interfaith Housing covenant be renewed. Carried unanimously. Pat Hershey distributed the new Endowment Policy for approval. The only material change from the 1994 version

involves the case of undesignated gifts. Upon receipt of an undesignated gift the "Church Council may direct that the Endowment Fund receive and hold for investment all or any portion thereof." The 1994 version stipulated that all undesignated funds go to the Endowment Fund. Ginny Leavitt moved and Robyn Roberts seconded that the new policy be approved. Carried unanimously. This policy will be presented to the Church Conference and will require a 3/4 positive vote for implementation.

COMMUNICATIONS – An invitation from the Interfaith Council of Contra Costa was received. The program will take place from 7-9 p.m. on November 15, 2009.

The Council was adjourned at 9 p.m. The next Church Council meeting will be November 17 at 7:30 p.m.
