I hope that our Holy Week worship opportunities blessed you as they did me. We are blessed by exceptional musical talent with our Organist, Ken Mansfield; Director of Music, Bunny Gruhn; and our growing Chancel Choir of 20 members! Our Worship Team, led by Jan Davis, coordinated the Good Friday Journey to the Cross, which was experienced by several in our congregation as well as many from the community. I am grateful for the worship Team's willingness to experiment with a new venture. Linda Berti once again arranged the Easter lilies donated by many of you. Several shared plantings for the Easter garden, providing a colorful setting for our fellowship. Cheen Chow and her family, with the assistance of others, coordinated our Easter Brunch, providing radical hospitality for guests, newcomers to the church, and visiting family members. Behind the scenes our Office Administrator, Lorri Sullivan, and Custodian, Jason Cano, provide support services to all of our ministries. We are blessed by the varied talents and generous sharing of gifts in many ways.

LUMC is one of over 370 local churches in the California-Nevada Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. We are under the leadership of one Bishop, Bishop Warner Brown. To assist him in oversight of these churches, we are divided into seven districts, each of which has historically been led by a District Superintendent. Due to the economic strains on our Conference, as of July 1, we will be served by four District Superintendents instead of seven. Our Bishop is seizing the current economic challenges to boldly lead our Conference in new directions. Key to that is reclaiming our missional focus of "making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." Bishop Brown will be holding a town hall on Saturday, April 17 from 10:00 a.m. -12:30 p.m. at Asbury UMC, Livermore, to share his vision. Lay Leader Robyn Roberts and I will attend; others are welcome to join us.

One thing birthed as a result of this economic right-sizing is circuits consisting of neighboring United Methodist Churches. We are part of the Diablo Valley Circuit, composed of the following UMCs: Concord; Concord Korean; Lafayette; St. Mark's, Orinda; East Bay Formosan, Walnut Creek; First, Walnut Creek; Tice Valley, WC; Walnut Ave., WC; Bethel Chinese Mission, WC. Together these nine congregations serve 1,600 members. The ten pastors serving these congregations are meeting monthly. We are beginning to envision how we might resource one another for our disciple-making ministry, such as training opportunities; joint youth events; worship

services for special holidays, etc. We are launching this venture with a pulpit exchange on April 18. Worship at LUMC will be led by one of the circuit pastors while I am leading worship at another of the circuit churches! We invite your openness to the fresh opportunities the Spirit is providing.
