LUMC Challenge to Sponsor a Child in the Philippines

Twelve years ago the California-Nevada Annual Conference honored Bishop Melvin G. Talbert's wife, Ethelou, with an offering dedicated to establishing the Ethelou D. Talbert Shelter for Girls. The shelter has since been incorporated with the Center for Children and Youth Welfare (Gilead Center) in the countryside. The Center's mission is to:

- 1. Provide education, food, and clothing to children suffering from the devastating effects of poverty;
- 2. Serve the poor in a caring and liberating way;
- 3. Journey with the poor in building a new heaven and a new earth.

Currently the program is housing and serving 32 children at a cost of \$707 per child, per year. The 2010 Annual Conference Offering goal is to raise funds to provide 50% of that cost.

LUMC's Finance Committee believes that LUMC has the heart and passion to fund the full cost of a child for a year – a total of \$707!! You are invited to help make that challenge. Donations for this cause will be received as a Special Offering on Sundays, May 23 and 30. Checks may be payable to LUMC, designated "Shelter for Girls."

LUMC Minutes of the Church Council Meeting of April 20, 2010

Members present: Chairperson Tom Henderson, Pastor Lori Sawdon, Robyn Roberts, Jack Cotteral, Pat Porter, Lynn Sabatini, Bob Lewis, Carol Slatten and Secretary Kurt Teichmann.

The meeting began with sharing of Joys and Concerns. Chairperson Henderson officially opened the formal meeting at 7:35 by announcing that the Committee would begin reviewing the "Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations." Two sections, Radical Hospitality and Passionate Worship were discussed.

The February 16, 2010 Church Council minutes were presented. Jack Cotteral noted that there was a policy exception with the Chairperson and Vice Chairperson of the Trustees having terms expiring the same year. This was discussed. Motion for approval made by Carol Slatten and seconded by Robyn Roberts. Approved unanimously.

FINANCE: Chairperson Bob Lewis reported that through March, pledged income was \$7,100 under expectations while non-pledged income was about \$7,500 above expectations. Plate offerings were \$400 under expectations while Special Offering was above \$700 above budget. Use of church facilities was on budget. Total Income was about \$900 over budget. Administrative office Maintenance and Building Maintenance expenses are running about \$3000 below budget. Programs were \$1200 over budget specifically Sierra Service Project/Choir and Music although this is a seasonal anomaly. Our Pastor's expenses are running \$1000 above expectations principally because of Health Insurance costs. Staff and Staff expenses are running about \$5,900 below budget of which about \$2,600 is because a Youth Director has not been hired. Overall, Net Income is currently about \$7,000 over budget. There were no significant Balance Sheet items to report.

TRUSTEES: Pastor Lori Sawdon reported that the Courtyard Committee has scheduled a meeting for 4/21. The Courtyard Committee will solicit expressions of interest from 10 landscapers. These will be narrowed down to three and then interviewed. The Courtyard Committee includes Mason Walters, Mark VandenBerghe, Wendell Pleis, Eric Schroter, Henry Kim, Robyn Roberts, and Pastor Lori Sawdon. Separately, Pastor Lori complimented the Clean Up Work Day efforts by many Boy Scouts and many church faithful. Hot water has been re-installed in the Pastor's Office Area lavatory. Also there has been some maintenance at the parsonage including cosmetic additions and creating a more efficient furnace system.

STAFF PARISH: Robyn Roberts reported that the Committee is looking for a Youth Leader. The selection committee is to include present youth leaders, Staff Parish Committee members, Pastor Sawdon, and some youths.

PROGRAM COUNCIL: It was reported that the Rummage Sale had netted \$5,200. Church Council commended the hard work of Ginny Leavitt and many, many LUMC faithful. The next event is a dinner at El Jaros on May 2nd.

ENDOWMENT: It was reported that Chairperson Doug Cowden was stranded in Rome because of the Icelandic volcano. Reports will be presented at the next meeting. It was

noted that the Committee Policy Revision first drafted some time ago is being worked on again.

OLD BUSINESS: None.

NEW BUSINESS: Robyn Roberts, Pastor Lori Sawdon, Tom Henderson and Dean Coons attended a Conference sponsored Rethink Church meeting presented by the Bishop at Asbury United Methodist Church in Livermore. At that meeting, it was announced that our Conference will be reconfigured from 7 Districts to 4 Districts. It was also announced that that each church will henceforth be responsible for its pastor's retirement benefits. The retirement benefits will no longer be part of the apportionments. It is recognized that some churches may have to share their ministers with other churches. The meeting also included discussion about the church's mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ and the effects of the economic crisis on the Conference. The Bishop stated that there is no list of ready remedies.

Pastor Lori presented information on the book <u>SiMPLE CHURCH</u>. After discussion, it was agreed that the book would be read by Committee members. Pastor Lori will order copies for each of the Committee members.

Motion to adjourn by Bob Lewis and seconded by Carol Slatten. Approve unanimously at 8:50 p.m.

PROPOSED ENDOWMENT POLICY CHANGES

LUMC's Endowment Fund was established in 1994, and has been providing grants for Inreach and Outreach projects ever since. Recently, Church Council unanimously approved a revised version of the written policy governing the Fund, and recommended that this revised version be submitted to an LUMC Church Conference for consideration and adoption.

In addition to updating the administrative provisions of the policy to reflect current practices, the revisions would change the treatment of undesignated gifts to the Church. In the past, any undesignated gifts were sent 100% to the Endowment Fund. The revised policy would change this to allow Church Council to decide what portion of future undesignated gifts would be sent to the Endowment Fund and what portion would be applied to other current needs (e.g., a special ministry or capital project).

To make it easier for members who are planning a gift to the church (e.g. in their will), Church Council also approved a new form that can be used to designate how a gift should be used. This new form is reproduced below, and you can get a copy for your use in the church office. Copies of the proposed revisions to the Endowment policy are also available in the church office, for members who are interested.

We are truly blessed to have an Endowment Fund, and grateful for the generous contributions that have made the Fund possible. If you would like to learn more about the Endowment Fund, this year's Inreach and Outreach grants, or the proposed changes to the policy, please stop by the Lower Fireside Room after church on June 6, 2010. We will have information available and people who can answer your questions.
